

Retaking the ACT

- ☐ Enter your ACT student ID found on your ACT score sheet
 - o If you did not take the ACT, you will not have an ACT ID
- ☐ Select the test date you wish to take the ACT
- ☐ Pay the fee to take the ACT online
- ☐ Upload a photo ID onto the ACT website

Taking the SAT

- ☐ Sign in to your free College Board account.
- ☐ Provide your full, legal name and other identifying information. Make sure it's the exact same name and information shown on your photo ID.
- ☐ Decide whether to sign up for the SAT with Essay. See which colleges recommend or require it.
- ☐ Upload a photo that meets very specific photo requirements.
- ☐ Check out, and print your Admission Ticket.

Fourth paragraph – summarize how you have met their requirements.

I have met all the qualifications and have included (list items, if any, you are attaching to back up what you have referred to in your application). Add any other information they have requested, such as names of references and contact information.
